#### Academic Probation

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Studentson academic probation, or continuing academic probation will have the following applied:

- 1) Academic adjustment requirement
  - This will require students on academic probation to meet with an advisor prior to any schedule adjustment.
- 2) Required meeting with the rofessional Academic Advisor

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- Within two weeks of the start of the term, the student will be required to meet with the Professional Academic Advisor to complete Academic Recovery Plan.
- 3) Required to complete a minimum of two Academic Recovery Programsodiae term.
  - Academic Recovery webinars will be selected in the Recovery Plan meeting with the advisor.

#### **Appeals**

When a student is academically dismissed, s/he is eligible to apply for an appeal if extenuating circumstances xist. If approved, the studenwill be placed on continuing academic probation required to meet conditions specified by the licy, the Committee on Academic Standing, and/or the Associate Vice President of Student Affairs, including, but not limited to, completing a specifie(s) pur limiting the number of credit hours for which the student may register, achieving a semester grade point average of 2.00, restriction from online courses, and successfully completion abework. If the appeal is not approved, the student must suit the required one full academic term (two semesters) after an initial dismissal, or three full ademic terms (six semesters), if dismissed more than once.
